ADVENTURES

BOAT CRUISES

Harbour cruises, Seal Island and Cape Point

Enjoy nature's tranquilizing effect while watching the African Sunset and spotting seals, dolphins, sharks and whales along the way.



KAYAKING

Lets get wet paddling in and around the bay! Leave Simon's Town Waterfront on a rented sea kayak, and paddle the warm waters of **False Bay**.



BEACHES

Swim with penguins on popular **Boulders Beach** or stroll along **Long Beach**.



PENGUIN COLONY

Enjoy a leisurely stroll along wooden walkways and view the African penguin in their natural habitat.



SCUBA DIVING

Scuba Diving Cape Town's coastal village of **Simon's Town, Glencairn, Kalk Bay and Muizenberg** offer fascinating adventure experiences. Diving activities include shipwrecks, huge kelp forests, coral gardens and deep reefs.



WALKING

Marvel at the architecture along **Simon's Historic Mile** (guided tours available) or enjoy a scenic "fynbos" walking trail up the **Simon's Town Kloof Mountains**.



MUSEUMS

Visit one of Simon's Town's four museums, including a naval & toy museum!

Discover the Simon's Town Waterfront Centre with specialty shops and restaurants.

WHALE WATCHING

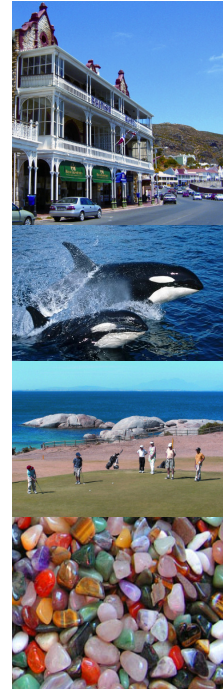
Simon's Town is one of the world's best places for viewing the Southern Right whales from September to November.

EXCURSIONS in and around the area

Cape Point

Tour the Cape Peninsula and enjoy one of South Africa's most spectacular coastal drives. The Cape of Good Hope Nature Reserve marks the cohesion of the West Coast cold Benguela current and the East Coast warm Agulhas current.

The Cape Point Nature Reserve is a beautiful park offering spectacular walking trails, bird watching and magnificent views.

Deep Sea Fishing

Professional charter services with experienced skippers and crew are available for big game fishing and birdwatching.

Deep sea fishing can be enjoyed all year around.

Sailing, Surfing and Kite Surfing

Muizenberg Beach is known for its gentle sloping white beach and consistent waves making it conducive to learning the art of surfing. Surf schools and local surf shops offer board hire and lessons, making it easy for you to jump into the water.

Horse Riding

Go splashing through the surf, enjoying a sunset or morning horse ride along the 7 kilometres of powder white beach in Noordhoek.



Camel Rides and Snake Park

Take the kids to enjoy a ride on the camels, and visit the worlds only married donkey couple!

Fynbos Walks

See spectacular ever changing fynbos (“indigenous fine bush”) and other native vegetation in the valleys and hills of the area, including Silvermine Nature Reserve.

Chapman’s Peak Drive

Chapman’s Peak Drive winds it way between Noordhoek and Hout Bay. Situated on the Atlantic Coast, at the south-western tip of South Africa, it’s one of the most spectacular marine drives anywhere in the world.

Baboon Walks

Experience baboon behaviour in their natural habitat – guided tours available.

Wine Tasting

Sample some of the world’s best wines at Groot Constantia approximately 30 minutes drive away.
